Major in Elementary Education leading to licensure (EDUC.15)

Program participants seeking elementary licensure must major in Elementary Education. The Elementary Education major provides K–6 licensure, allowing students to teach in public as well as private/ independent schools. Licensure from the state of Mississippi is reciprocal with many other states. Students are encouraged to double major and/or seek at least two teaching areas of concentration of 21 hours each, one of which must be in the area of reading. A major in Elementary Education requires a minimum of 52 hours, including 12 credit hours in student teaching. These include the following courses:

- _____ Upon curriculum committee approval, Education majors will be required to complete a 4 hour course pertaining to the Teaching of Mathematics in the Elementary School.

Supplemental Licensure in special education is available with the addition of Advanced Practicum: Special Education I (EDUC 3860). An additional two weeks of student teaching in a Special Education classroom is recommended.
