1) What are the costs for a BSC student at Millsaps?

A: Millsaps is committed to the completion of your degree with no additional costs beyond what finishing at BSC would have cost. To that end, your net tuition and fees (exclusive of federal aid, which is determined by the US Department of Education) at Millsaps will be no more than it was at BSC, within the parameters of Millsaps' financial aid policy, which requires living on campus to receive maximum financial aid.

In addition, Millsaps College offers three convenient payment plans to provide a flexible and cost-effective way to manage college expenses.
